Looking at Trees Mitigoog (Ojibwe)

You can figure out what species a tree (mitigoog) is by looking at its leaves, bark, twigs, flowers, fruit, and seeds. Even the shape of a tree can give clues to the tree's identity. What trees can you find at Spearhead?

 to figure out if a tree is coniferous or
 deciduous and which species you are
 looking at.
- Hike the "Who's Who?" Tree ID Trail
 Use signs along this trail to compare
 characteristics of common tree look-alikes.
 Learn their Ojibwe names.
